

Episode 30: Audio-only. Due to my recent illness, we were unable to shoot a video episode this weekend. This week's lesson shows us how *acabar + de + infinitive* is a useful expression that means, "to have just done something." You just conjugate *acabar* in the present tense, add *de*, and then add an infinitive. For example, "I just read the book" would be "Yo acabo de leer el libro." You'll find more examples of this concept on this week's audio-only episode of Rolling R's. Here are the present-tense conjugations of Acabar:

Yo	acabo	Nosotros(as)	acabamos
Tú	acabas	Vosotros(as)	acabáis
Usted		Ustedes	
Él	acaba	Ellos	acaban
Ella		Ellas
